## Conference Summary: "Safety Across the Borders Conference / Workshop" - September 2013

On Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> September at the De Hall in Ikeja, over 200 health professionals, from hospitals and health centres around Lagos, met for a one-day conference / workshop titled 'Safety across the Border. This event was organised by Stream Pharmaceutical UK in conjunction with the Lagos State Safety Commission and the Ministry of Health. Stream Pharmaceutical UK have previous experience in this area by working with organisations and government bodies in UK, Ghana, Saudi Arabia and Namibia.

Dr Alero Roberts was the *Conference moderator* and the day started with an introductory speech by the Director General / CEO of the Lagos State Safety Commission, Mrs Dominga Odebunmi, who welcomed everyone to this important event. The day continued with both local and international speakers covering all aspects of safety within the healthcare environment.

During the afternoon the delegates were divided into two sessions. The pharmacists attended the workshop titled "Clinical Governance and Medication Errors". The remaining delegates, who consisted of doctors, lab scientists, departmental heads, representatives from the Lagos State Safety Commission and the Ministry of Health, attended a workshop which considered aspects of patient safety and health sector reforms.

Speakers at the conference included Dr O. Olatunji, *Permanent Secretary, Health Services Commission Lagos State*, Dr Leke Pitan, *African Advisor International Hospital Federation and former Commissioner of Health Lagos State*, Professor Ayo Atsenuwa, *Nigerian Institute of Advanced Legal Studies and Consultant to Stream Pharmaceutical and* Remi Babalola *from Remi Babalola Nigerian Red Cross Initiative*. The international speakers were Joe Crombie *the Executive Technical Director of Stream Pharmaceutical and* Elizabeth Ozogolu *NHS UK Prescriber Advisor and a consultant to Stream Pharmaceutical UK*.

The day ended with a panel session where all delegates were invited to discuss their concerns and ideas with the speakers. The general consensus according to the evaluation forms completed that day indicated that delegates had developed a greater awareness of safety and now felt 'empowered' to provide a better service to the patients within their care.

- "This training was a pacesetter. It sets a good standard for all healthcare professionals. This was the best training this year so far".
- "Training was well coordinated".
- "Educative, well informed, more needed".
- "Good workshops, more needed".
